Searching for the spectacular Mountain Gorillas in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, chimpanzee tracking in Kyambura Gorge, multiple game drives in Queen Elizabeth National Park with its amazing selection of wildlife, including the tree climbing lions, and an optional visit to Ngamba Island Chimpanzee Sanctuary on the beautiful Lake Victoria: just some of the very best reasons to visit Uganda. With luxury accommodation, professional guides and custom made safari vehicles - this safari will be the trip of a lifetime.

Day 1: Entebbe

On arrival at Entebbe International Airport you will be met by a Wild Frontiers representative and transferred to your hotel. Entebbe is a small, quiet town located on the shores of Lake Victoria and is easy to explore on foot, boda bodas (local motorbike) or taxis. Soak up the local markets filled with clothes and crafts, shop for souvenirs in curio shops, or explore the Botanical Gardens on Lake Victoria. Enjoy the wide variety of restaurants serving many different cuisines as well as several bars and clubs where you can sample the local beer, catch a game of football and chat with the local Ugandans, known for their open, friendly nature. Overnight at Boma, a small family run quest house.

Day 2: Entebbe, Bwindi

Transfer from Boma to the domestic airport for your scheduled flight to Kihihi airstrip, which is located between Bwindi/Queen Elizabeth National parks. The flight takes just over an hour. Transfer to Buhoma Lodge, Bwindi Impenetrable Forest. The drive to the lodge is through local villages and mountain roads – lovely scenery and very interesting en-route! Guests will have the opportunity for two days of gorilla tracking (pre-booking essential). Other optional activities that may be enjoyed in and around the park include forest walks, visits to a local school or orphanage or Batwa pygmy village, and curio shopping. Bwindi National Park, located in south western Uganda on the edge of the Great Rift Valley, is considered the most diverse forest in Uganda. Home to over 120 mammals, 345 species of birds, 200 species of butterflies, and 160 species of trees, Bwindi is one of the richest ecosystems in East Africa. The park contains almost one half of the world's population of the endangered Mountain Gorilla, making it an extremely valuable conservation site. Overnight at Buhoma Lodge. Situated on the slopes of the Forests of Bwindi, this intimate lodge offers uninterrupted views of the pristine rain forest canopy. It's the perfect, tranquil base from which to visit Bwindi. Day 3: Bwindi (Gorilla Tracking - Impenetrable Forest National Park)

Today will be a lifetime experience! Coming face to face with mountain gorillas is a rare wildlife encounter. Experienced guides and trackers will accompany your party on an early morning trek into the dense rain forest on the mountain slopes. The opportunity to come within meters of these magnificent apes, sharing in their daily lives and experiencing their day-to-day activities, is an experience you won't soon forget! Mountain gorillas are extremely rare with only an estimated 880 remaining in the wild. Please note that gorilla tracking may be fairly strenuous with treks ranging from 30 mins up to six hours or longer, at high altitudes. Mountain gorillas are wild animals and, as such, sightings cannot be guaranteed. However viewing success rates are over 95%. Following the trek, return to your accommodation and, if time allows, take an optional guided afternoon forest or community walk. [B/L/D]

Day 4: Bwindi


Those with pre-purchased permits will depart for a second gorilla tracking experience following breakfast at the lodge. Depending upon individual itinerary schedules, guests not tracking gorillas

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may wish to enjoy other activities available in the area such as a forest walk, a visit to a local school/orphanage/hospital, or Batwa pygmy village, and some local curio shopping. [B/L/D]

Day 5: Bwindi, Ishasha

This morning we depart Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park and travel (2-3 hours) to Ishasha in the southern part of Queen Elizabeth National Park. Time permitting, we may visit a Community Project enroute. Here the local people



allow you to enjoy some time in their homesteads, as well as see some of the crops and curios they produce, and visit the local elephant trench project – which stops elephants coming into the village and raiding crops. Afternoon game drives will be enjoyed in the Ishasha area, looking for the huge herds of buffalo, elephant, Uganda kob and of course the famous tree-climbing lion typically found in the area. Overnight at Ishasha Wilderness Camp. This exclusive 10 tented camp offers the only luxury accommodation in the remote southern sector of Queen Elizabeth. Queen Elizabeth National Park spreads over 1,978sq km in the western arm of the Great Rift Valley and is home to a wide variety of wildlife including elephants, leopard, lions, hippos, buffalo, Uganda kob, baboon, and many species of birds. With both a riverine and savannah habitat, the park includes the southern Ishasha area with the massive Maramagambo, one of the largest surviving natural forests in Uganda. [B/L/D]

Day 6: Ishasha

Spend the day enjoying game drives in the Ishasha sector of Queen Elizabeth National Park and visit the Ishasha Community Project. Enjoy scenic sundowners with drinks/snacks included. Overnight at Ishasha Wilderness Camp. [B/L/D]

Day 7: Ishasha, Mweya (Game Drives & Boat Cruise)

Today we depart Ishasha to the 'Mweya' sector of the National park to enjoy a leisurely boat cruise along the Kazinga Channel. Kazinga's shores are a haven for numerous birds, including many migratory species as they make their way south to warmer climates. The cruise also provides a spectacular view of the beautiful Mweya Peninsula and life in local fishing villages set along the banks. Overnight at Mweya Safari Lodge, located on a peninsula overlooking the Kazinga Channel on one side and the Rwenzori Mountains on the other. [B/L/D]

Day 8: Mweya, Chamburu, Entebbe

This morning we will travel early to the Chamburu Gorge (Kyamaburu) to enjoy Chimpanzee trekking. The forest is alive with noise - chimpanzees can be quite active and may move quickly through the forest canopy... or, if you are lucky, you may find them resting or eating near the forest floors. It's an exhilarating walk, in beautiful scenery. Sightings cannot be guaranteed even though they are habituated to humans. After this activity, we depart to the airstrip nearby for the flight to Entebbe. In case of delays, we suggest booking a later (evening) flight out if you plan to depart tonight. We can, of course, arrange additional accommodation or safaris after this trip. [B/L]

Important Notices:

Travel insurance: Is compulsory for all guests traveling to Uganda.

Health: Yellow fever inoculations are compulsory and & malaria prophylactics are recommended. For gorilla/chimp trekking it is imperative that you are healthy and free of any disease or virus – officials do have the right to refuse entry if you are found to have or show any signs of communicable illnesses. Should you opt to spend time participating in the UWEC Wildlife Integration programs, you may require additional inoculations and health clearances.

Visas: Most nationalities require a visa to enter Uganda which can be obtained on arrival for \$50 per person, single entry. Passports must be valid for a minimum of 6 months or 12 months in the case of UK nationals. The newly established EAC Visa allows entry into Uganda, Rwanda and Kenya for one fee of \$100 – handy if you are visiting all three regions.

Flights: It is imperative that you reconfirm your onward/return flights. Our office in Uganda can assist you with this.
