

**Cape Horn and Falklands (Malvinas)  
9 days - 8 nights**

**Ushuaia, Cape Horn, Falkland Sound, Carcass Island, Saunders Island, Punta Arenas  
Adventure, Eco-Tourism, Discovery**

**This program is fully customizable and may be operated for individuals, pods and small groups**

*Cape Horn, this remote island at the tip of South America is a rare destination for the adventurous traveler. A visit here is the stuff of legends. Penguins, whales, seals, and seabirds congregate in the Southern Ocean during the austral summer. Present in large numbers, you will move along in their world, finding endless inspiration for photographs. Setting foot on these distant lands is a privilege and an honor. You will bring home unforgettable tales, and your journey will arouse the curiosity and admiration of your friends and family.*

**Day 1 - Sat: Ushuaia, Embarkation**

Your journey begins at the pier in Ushuaia, Argentina, with embarkation between 7 and 8 PM. Board your ship and sail along the Beagle Channel towards Puerto Williams, Chile, the southernmost town in the world, where the ship will clear formalities to approach Cape Horn. [D]

**Day 2 - Sun: Cape Horn**

After an overnight crossing of Nassau Bay, you awake in full view of legendary Cape Horn! Weather permitting, board a Zodiac and be one of the few privileged adventurers to step foot on this famous and rarely visited island. Sail and explore the area in depth before setting course north towards the Falkland Islands (Islas Malvinas). [B/L/D]

**Day 3 - Mon: At Sea**

As you sail through the South Atlantic en route to the Falkland Islands (Islas Malvinas), attend an engaging program of informative presentations. In the company of expert guides, watch for bird and marine life from the lounge or from the outside decks. You may spot magnificent seabirds, such as albatrosses and petrels, as well as different species of whales. [B/L/D]

**Day 4 - Tue: West Falklands (South)**

Ruggedly beautiful and remote, places such as New Island, Weddell Island or West Point are located at the extreme west of the Falklands' archipelago. See dramatic cliffs contrast with sheltered sandy bays and natural harbors. These areas host a large concentration of wildlife with lots of diversity. Some of the best wildlife experiences are just a short distance from the settlements. [B/L/D]

**Day 5 - Wed: West Falklands (North), Carcass & Saunders Idsslan**

Named after HMS Carcass, which visited in the late 18th century, the terrain is varied with rocky ridges, steep cliffs, open plains, white sand beaches and coves. Saunders is the second largest offshore island and has very varied terrain, from rocky hills to sweeping shorelines. It is an important natural habitat for birds and offers exceptional wildlife viewing opportunities. All five breeding species of penguin can be spotted here along with black-browed albatross and many other birds. [B/L/D]

**Day 6 -Thu: The Falkland Sound**

You cruise down the Falkland Sound, sightseeing its rugged and untouched landscapes. We immerse ourselves in the past and recent history of the islands. You visit settlements and meet the locals, getting to know the culture of farming families. As we stop at sites that were active battlefields during the 1982 conflict, our historians introduce us to regional geopolitics. [B/L/D]

**Day 7 - Fri: Port Stanley**

Join our expedition team on guided walking tours in town or to Gipsy Cove. Or take the option to explore on your own and absorb the atmosphere, grabbing lunch at the local pub, visiting the

maritime museum, the church, hunting for souvenirs or walking down Ross Road, paying tribute at the war memorials at the waterfront. (See options). [B/L/D]

**Day 8 - Sat: Disembarkation**

Transfer to the airport at Mt. Pleasant will be provided from the ship according to the scheduled flight. Board your flight to Punta Arenas (Chile). On arrival take the shuttle to the hotel. This afternoon you may opt to visit the Explorers House to relax, share your experiences with other cruise travelers and browse books about Antarctica. [B]



**Day 9 – Sun: Punta Arenas, USA**

At the appropriate time take the hotel shuttle to the airport to board your connecting flight back home. [B]

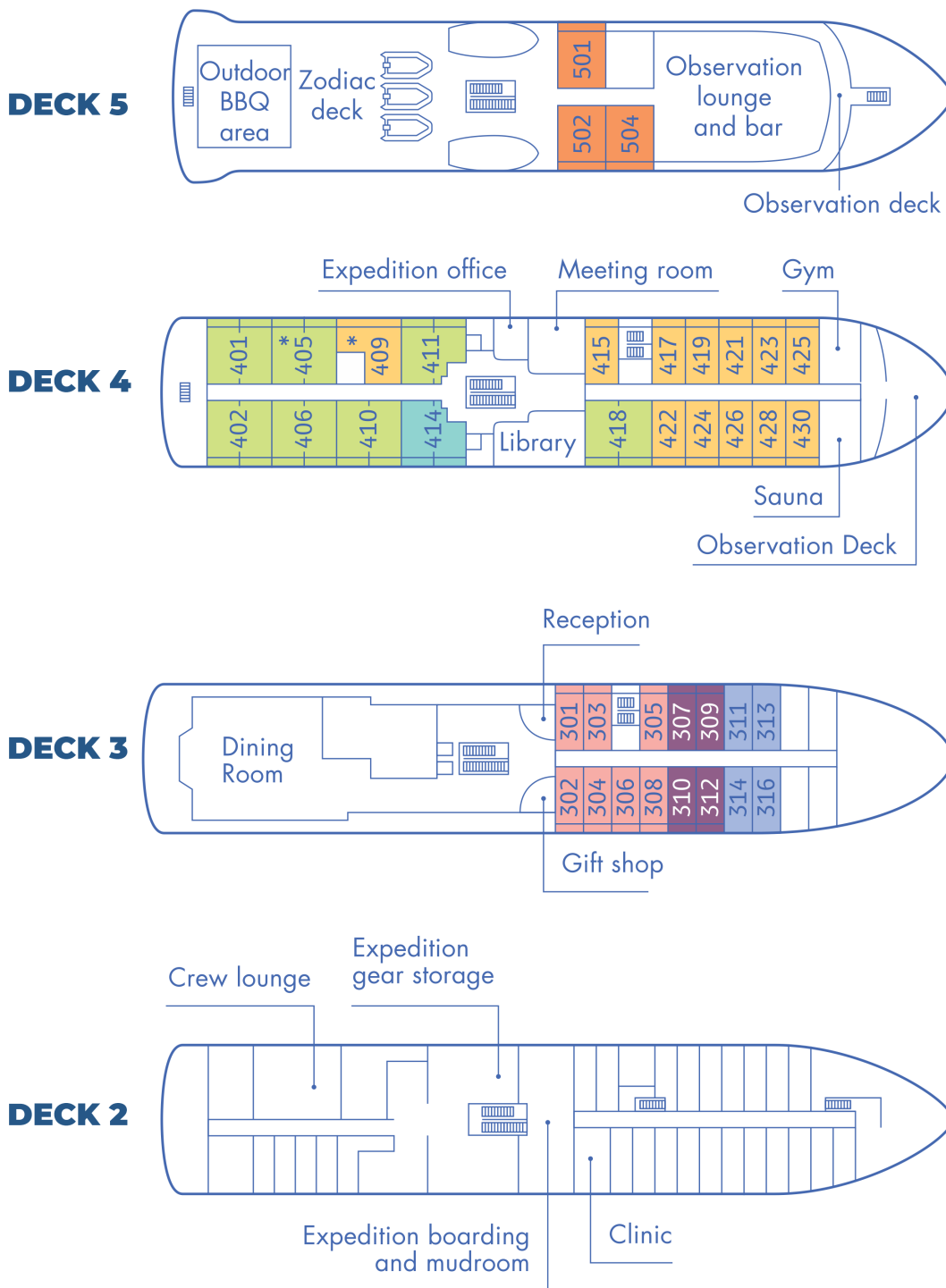

**Your Cruise:**

Magellan Explorer is a new and modern expedition vessel custom built for our Antarctic and sub-Antarctic expeditions. The ship was constructed in Chile to the latest Polar Code specifications. Magellan Explorer has seven categories of accommodation, including dedicated single cabins. All cabins except Porthole cabins feature private balconies. The majority of double cabins have two twin beds that can be configured as one king-size bed. Some double cabins can only be configured with a queen-size bed. All cabins feature a wardrobe, individually controlled heating system, a sitting area, and a private bathroom with shower. The ship features a glass-enclosed observation lounge and presentation room with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment, a spacious and stylish dining room, a well-stocked bar, a library, a meeting room, a gym, a sauna, and a medical clinic. The forward-facing observation deck leads to the bow of the ship, which is accessible to guests to offer proximity to marine wildlife. The ship has a fleet of 10 Zodiac boats that are well suited for disembarking and wildlife watching. The fitness center aboard Magellan Explorer has been designed and built by the professionals at Anytime Fitness, the world's only fitness company with boutique gyms in all seven continents.
